LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

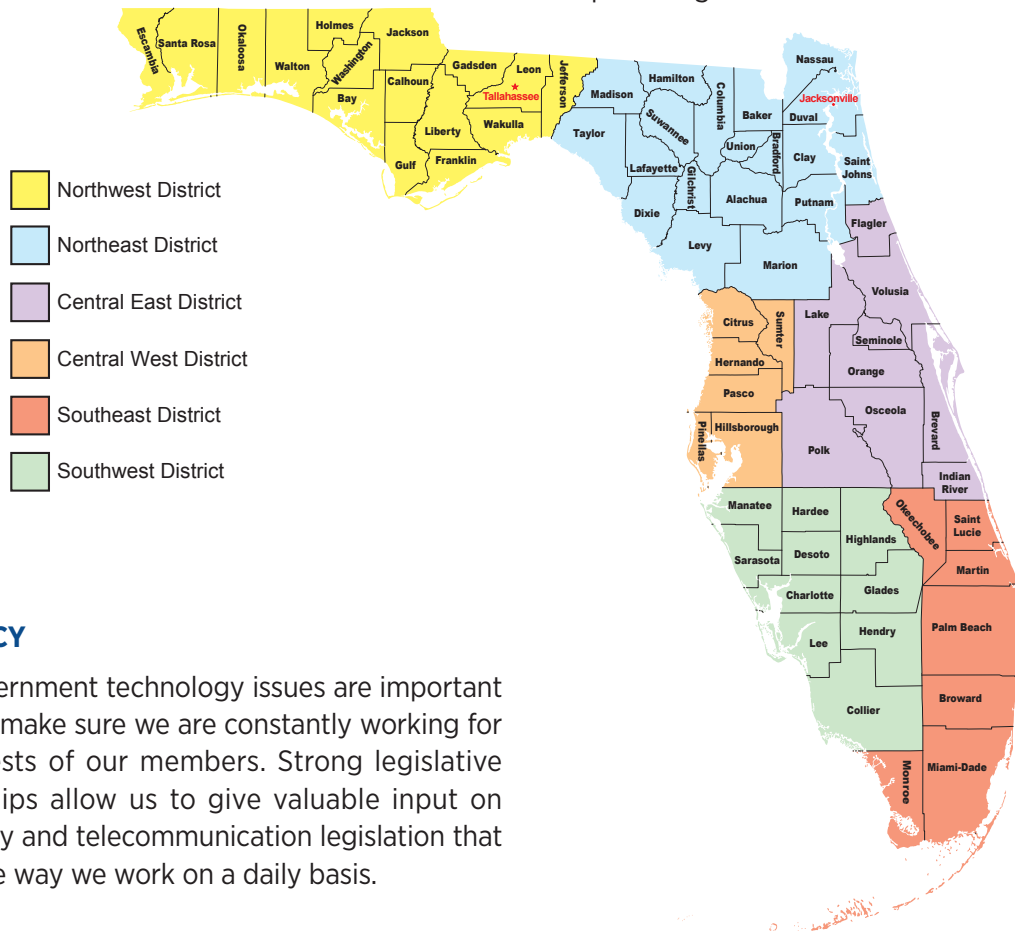
